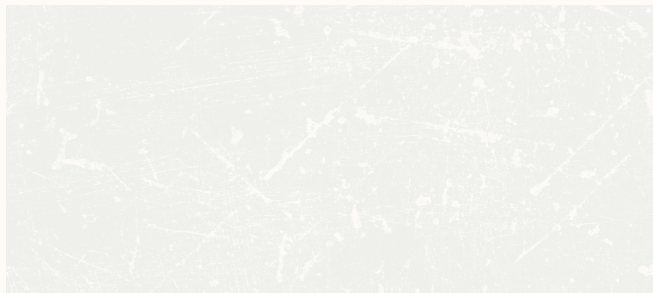

SITE

At less than 1/4 square mile, the Cole Ranch AVA is the smallest appellation in the U.S.A. The AVA is located between the Russian River and Anderson Valley at elevations ranging from 1400-1600ft. Surrounded by forested hills, it is unique for its terrarium-like setting and late ripening relative to neighboring Ukiah. This 55-acre vineyard was planted in 1971 by John Cole, and is now under the management of our friends Mike Lucia & Jill Shadek.

VINIFICATION

1.74 T of Pinot Noir (82%) and .37 T (18%) of Chardonnay hand-harvested on Sept 25th. The fruit was gently crushed and sent direct-to-press. Co-fermented on wild yeasts in neutral French oak barrels, completing a long, slow malolactic fermentation. Racked to steel for a 1-month settling before bottling.
